- Collaborate with therapists, case managers, and peer specialists to identify engagement goals for treatment planning.
- Generate various letters to clients regarding attendance requirements.
- Notify therapists, case managers, and peer specialists if clients need discharged.
- Assist clients with linkage to C&A or other community resources as indicated.
- Contact post-hospital clients to coordinate transitions and engagement in services.
- Document clear and comprehensive contact notes in client chart.
- Participate in trainings as determined by supervisor to develop and reinforce skills necessary to competently serve designated populations.

- Related responsibilities as assigned.

Skills and Experience

- Minimum 3 years experience working with children and families with mental, emotional, developmental, and /or behavioral disorders.
- Knowledge of services, programs, and resources available in Stark County to assist families in meeting the challenges of their children’s needs.
- Ability to work effectively with other professionals and different disciplines, both within and outside the mental health profession, to meet the various needs of children and families.
- Must possess skills to conceptualize client/system needs and recommend appropriate services. Training and experience that is “trauma-informed” as well as background/knowledge of programs such as MST, WrapAround, and others pertaining to applicable populations are valuable.
- Must have excellent people skills, communication skills, and engagement skills and be able to function well as a team member.
