Responsibilities

- Ongoing exploration of a caregiver's and family's recovery, resiliency, and wellness needs.
- Supporting caregivers and families in achieving recovery, resiliency, and wellness goals through increased knowledge, skills and connection as identified by the caregiver and family.
- Encouraging hope.
- Supporting families and caregivers in the development of life skills such as budgeting and connecting to community resources.
- Modeling personal responsibility for resiliency, recovery and wellness.
- Teaching and coaching skills to effectively navigate the health care delivery systems to effectively and efficiently utilize services.

- Providing individual or group facilitation that addresses symptoms, skills, and behaviors to assist caregivers and families in eliminating barriers to seeking, achieving, or maintaining recovery, employment, education, or housing.
- Assisting with accessing and developing natural support systems in the community.
- Promoting coordination and linkage among similar providers.
- Coordinating or assisting in crisis interventions and stabilization as needed.
- Conducting outreach and community education.
- Attending and participating in team decision making.
- Assisting caregivers and families in the development of empowerment skills through self-advocacy and activities that mitigate discrimination and inspire hope.
- Assist caregivers and families in overcoming barriers that impede their ability to obtain the appropriate and necessary services and care for their children.
- Providing services in a culturally inclusive and competent manner which includes not practicing, condoning, facilitating, or collaborating in any form of discrimination on the basis of ethnicity, race, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion, national origin, marital status, political belief, or mental or physical disability.
- Other duties, as assigned.

Skill and Experience

- Program development tasks, including design, financing, staffing, and evaluation of MST/MST-PSB services.
- Supervision of professional and administrative staff.
- Coordination of services with other community providers.
- Ability to work effectively with other professionals and different disciplines required.
- Knowledge of health and social services available to children, adolescents, and families in Stark County is valuable.
- Must possess skills to conceptualize client/system needs and recommend appropriate services. Training and experience that is “trauma-informed” required.
- Must be culturally competent and willing to work with clients and families within various and diverse populations.
- Possess a basic understanding of ecological and behavioral treatment and systems theories and their application in the field of children’s mental health services.
- Possess an understanding of juvenile justice policies, procedures and trends.
- Training will be provided for qualified candidates who have no previous training or history of intensive home-based or MST services.

- Experience working with youth at-risk and their families, required.
- Experience working with other child/family service systems, required.
- System experience as a recipient, preferred.

- Ability to work with diverse populations, required.
- Must be flexible, knowledgeable of community resources, and a team player.
- Must hold OMHAS Peer Certification or be willing and eligible to obtain certification.
